This project based class focuses on skills required to successfully design and develop websites. Students will use Adobe Photoshop to create images acceptable for web usage. Furthermore, focus will be placed on understanding HTML, Javascript, and CSS, and how these languages are used in website construction. Students will be expected to hand write code. Other web technologies such as Flash animation will also be explored.
